

# NOVEL CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

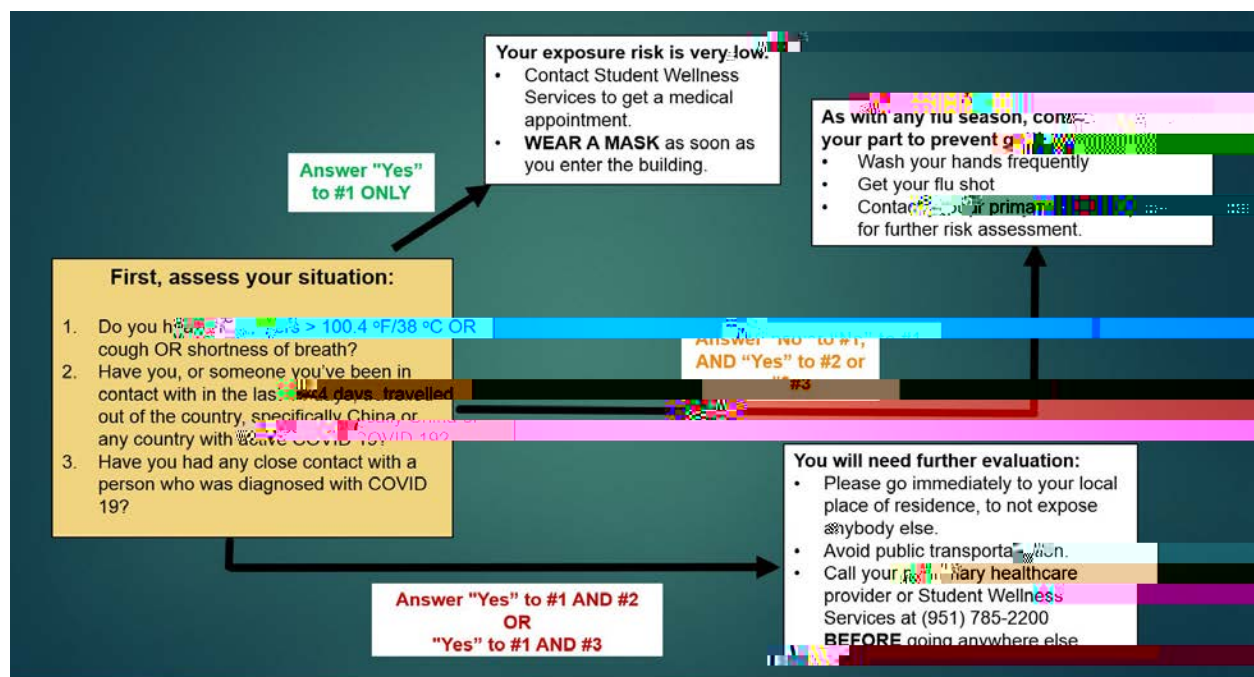
On March 4, 2020 California Governor Gavin Newsom (D) declared a state of emergency after the first death from coronavirus in Roseville, CA. Newsom's reasoning for this is that it "...will help the state further prepare our communities and our health care system in the event it spreads more broadly (Budryk, 2020)

At this time there are still no confirmed cases of the novel coronavirus (COVID) in Riverside County. As the virus continues to spread, we encourage you to do your part to prevent infection and spread of disease. Wash your hands, cover your cough/sneeze, avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth, and stay at home if you're sick. More individuals in the U.S., will get infected as the virus spreads. However, most infected patients so far (80%) have experienced mild illness only according to a report from the World Health Organization (March 1, 2020).

Typically, human coronaviruses cause symptoms similar to the flu including:

- x Fever
- x Runny nose
- x Headache
- x Cough
- x Sore throat
